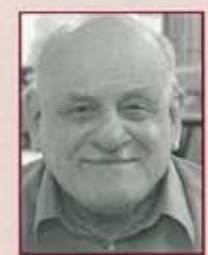

Ernie Small

Ernie served in the Grenadier Guards and landed on Sword Beach during D-Day. Afterwards Ernie fought all the way to Berlin. He fought at Caen, The Battle of the Bulge, Nijmegen, Arnhem, liberated Belsen and was one of the first British troops into Berlin. After the War he worked as a removals van driver. In 1993 a stroke left him unable to walk or use his left arm and he came to The Royal Star & Garter Home. With intensive physiotherapy he has made significant improvements. He goes on regular outings which he enjoys immensely.



Louis Pengelly-Phillips

Louis served in the Royal Marines. After basic training he served with a special unit which protected Winston Churchill himself while he visited Canada for the Yalta Conference. Later Louis was one of the first ashore as part of D-Day. He landed on Gold Beach and it took all day to take the beach.

Over the next three months he fought all the way through to Belgium. Then he went to serve in the Far East in Burma where he fought the Japanese. After the War he worked as a farmer before he fell from a window and broke his neck in 1952. Now, confined to a wheelchair, he lives at our Richmond home and regularly takes part in fundraising activities.

The Royal Star & Garter Charity, established in 1916, has always depended on voluntary support and fundraising activity to maintain the high standards of care. Over the years many thousands of disabled ex-Service men and women have benefited from our special care. Today our ex-Service men and women residents enjoy a full life at our Richmond home and we have embarked on an ambitious development programme to build new homes around the country. The first of these will be in Solihull, due to open in the summer of 2008 and a new home to replace our Richmond home is planned for late 2010. We have also recently extended our services to include the widows, spouses and partners of ex-Service men and women.

The Royal Star & Garter Charity

The Royal Star & Garter Charity was founded in 1916 by Queen Mary and the British Red Cross Society. Originally housed in the old Star & Garter Hotel, the current building was constructed between 1919 and 1924 and opened by King George V and Queen Mary. All the residents at that time were young men, many of whom were able to return home following a period of rehabilitation.

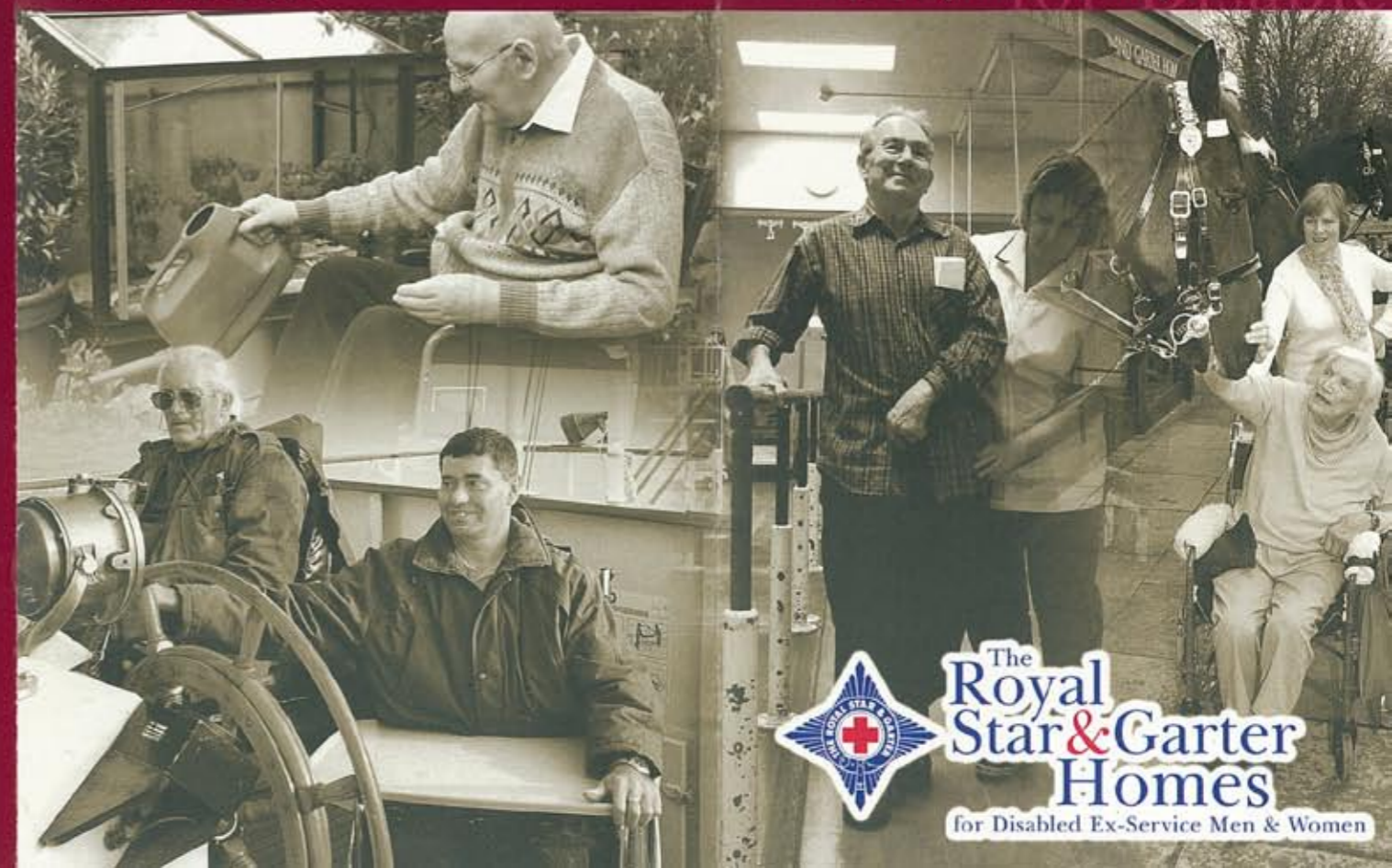
